Always...Our first and highest priority is to protect and advocate for our residents and staff.

Charles County is experiencing **significant** community spread however according to the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services and the Maryland Department of Health, visitation may still occur. Therefore, Sagepoint is requiring additional measures that are now in place to protect the most vulnerable, our residents.

- Masks and eye protection are required in all settings and visitors are required to wear eye protection and N95 masks during the entire visit.
- Visitors can not remove their masks or eye protection until they leave the facility.
- Residents on Unit 100 will visit in the Red-Carpet Room
- Residents on Unit 200 will visit in the Dining Room.
- Outdoor visits are **HIGHLY** recommended at this time.

Please be aware of the risk of potential exposure either from you to the resident or to you when you visit.

If you are an at-risk or immunocompromised individual, do not visit at this time.

Our latest round of weekly testing has resulted in 5 vaccinated and boosted residents and 4 vaccinated and boosted staff testing positive. All CDC and Maryland Department of Health Guidelines are being followed.

Our latest round of weekly testing has resulted in 4 vaccinated and boosted staff testing positive. No residents have tested positive. All CDC and Maryland Department of Health Guidelines are being followed.
